Gay Day, Picnic in Parnership with Rainbow Families, and Divas Outdoors highlight a series of GLBT programming at Hillwood this September

WASHINGTON—Now in its 13th year of partnering actively with the GLBT community, Hillwood Estate, Museum and Gardens is presenting a series of lively, engaging, and welcoming programs throughout the month of September. The *Family Picnic in Partnership with Rainbow Families DC* will be from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, September 6, followed by *Gay Day* from 1 to 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 14, and *Divas Outdoors: Classic Films Under the Stars*, beginning at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 18.

Since 2001, with the formation of the GLBT Advisory Committee, Hillwood has built on founder

Marjorie Merriweather Post's gracious tradition of opening her home for enjoyment, enrichment, and relaxation with programs that welcome and unite with the GLBT community in Washington, D.C. In a nod to Post's lovely garden parties, the GLBT *Family Picnic in partnership with Rainbow Families DC* will start off the series of programs on September 6. In



addition to picnicking on the Lunar Lawn, families can also decorate their own gold boxes inspired by pieces in the special exhibition, *Cartier: Marjorie Merriweather Post's Dazzling Gems*. There will also be putting on the Putting Green, as well as dress-ups, games, and face-painting.

This year, the exquisite jewelry and luxury objects collected by and designed specially for Marjorie Post, style icon and favored Cartier client, add a touch of sparkle to <u>Gay Day</u> on

September 14, while Post's fashions and fall flowers are tapped for a further look at the beauty of Hillwood. Throughout the day, visitors will be treated to gallery talks in the special exhibition Cartier: Marjorie Merriweather Post's Dazzling Gems, while the head of greenhouse and design operations, Jason Gedeik, demonstrates the creation of magnificent floral arrangements with an abundance of flowers from the Cutting Garden—in magnificent bloom in September, and associate curator of textiles, Howard Kurtz, discusses selections from Post's collection of dresses and apparel, on view on the second floor of the Mansion. Historian and curator of material culture, Estella Chung, will describe the newly-refurbished Staff Dining Room, illustrating staff life at Hillwood in the 1950s and '60s. Behind-the-scenes views into rooms and spaces not usually accessible to the public, including the massage room, the ladies' powder room, film projection booth, and fallout shelter, provide a glimpse into Post's mid-century lifestyle. Performances from the Rock Creek Singers of Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, Not What You Think, and DC Lambda Squares showcase the contributions of our community partners. In between activities, visitors are invited to view the special exhibition, enjoy a picnic lunch, pick up a special item in Hillwood's popular Museum Shop, or take a look at the vintage cars on view with the Straight Eights Car Club.

Divas Outdoors: Classic Films Under the Stars with our presenting partner Reel Affirmations

has moved from June to September, bringing campy fun to the Lunar Lawn on Thursday, September 18 with *Some Like it Hot*. This late summer evening begins with creative spreads across the lawn, all vying for the top spot in the picnic competition. Guests are invited to make a full night of it, exploring Hillwood's pristine gardens, the art collection in the Mansion, and the special exhibition *Cartier: Marjorie Merriweather Post's Dazzling Gems* before the film begins.
