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HOLIDAYS AT HILLWOOD

Russian Winter Festival, wreath making workshops, and hand-made ornaments in the spirit of the exhibition *Prêt-à-Papier* are part of the Christmas splendor at Hillwood this season

WASHINGTON—Hand-made paper ornaments and classic holiday greenery bring a festive and traditional holiday feeling to Hillwood Estate, Museum and Gardens this year. Seasonal activities provide fun for all ages while crisp winter gardens offer an oasis for visitors to Hillwood looking for an escape from the holiday buzz.

Beginning on Friday, November 23, holiday decorations and greenery adorn the entire estate. In addition to lights, flowers, ribbons, and greenery throughout the gardens and Mansion, décor unique to Hillwood reflects the sophisticated style of its founder Marjorie Merriweather Post. Inspired by Post's holiday tables over the years and featuring exquisite sets from the collection, the Dining and Breakfast Room tables will sparkle with cheerful displays. In a nod to the inventive exhibition Prêt-à-Papier: The Exquisite Art of Isabelle de
Borchgrave, on view through the end of the year, Hillwood staff and volunteers created hundreds of paper ornaments and strings of garland to decorate the festive Visitor Center tree.

The <u>gardens</u> reveal another aspect of their ever-changing beauty during the holiday season. Conifers such as the blue atlas cedar and false cypress show off their evergreen boughs, while holly and witchhazel provide bright spots of color. Pine trees adjacent to the Mansion will be lighted this year to lead the way into the holiday splendor. Seasonal greenery is also the focus of several <u>workshops</u> in December.

The family highlight of the holiday season at Hillwood is undoubtedly the <u>Russian Winter</u> <u>Festival</u>, on Saturday and Sunday, December 8 and 9. Grandfather Frost and the Snow Maiden are on hand for this celebration of the holidays in Old Russian style.

Throughout the holiday season, Hillwood's museum shop features a variety of decorations and gifts, including hand-painted Russian egg ornaments and nesting dolls, and a whimsical line of paper ornaments and objects in conjunction with *Prêt-à-Papier*. Two special Sundays also offer visitors the chance simply to immerse themselves in the oasis of Hillwood during the holidays.

An annual holiday favorite! Hillwood celebrates the holidays in Old Russian style. A new one-act play based on traditional Russian stories of Grandfather Frost and the Snow Maiden will be performed for the festival this year. After each performance, families can meet Grandfather Frost, Russia's Santa Claus, and his granddaughter the Snow Maiden, and have pictures taken with them. Samovar will play lively winter Russian folk music while actors from Happenstance Theater stroll the estate in character, enacting the old Russian winter custom of *mumming*—dressing up in costume and visiting friends, singing, and playing jokes—and fortunetelling. A hands-on art activity will allow visitors of all ages to create their own *kokoshnik*, a lady's headdress, or traditional Russian gentleman's hat. Shopping and festive dining in the café round out this day of family fun.
