Meet the Choreographers

Ashanté Green, from Ft. Washington, Maryland, began dancing at age seven at the Dance Institute of Washington and trained with the Dance Theatre of Harlem at the Kennedy Center. She studied under Debbie Allen and performed in Pepito's Story in 2002. She attended the Baltimore School for the Arts, earned a BFA in dance from Shenandoah University in 2014, and a Master's in Performance Arts Leadership and Management in 2015. Ashanté returned to DIW, where she is now Creative Director and lead choreographer. Her work has been featured in Dance Teacher Magazine, awarded at YAGP, and showcased at the International Association of Blacks in Dance Conference. In 2021, she directed "Our Spiritual Journey," a dance production on Black diasporic history and culture. Ashanté Green has a proven track record of success in both leadership and teaching roles, having directed award-winning productions and worked with students nationally and internationally.

Daniel L. Moore, native of Washington, DC, has worked with many different outstanding companies including Complexions Contemporary Ballet. Mr. Moore was selected out of hundreds to be on a pilot show called A Chance to Dance, produced by Nigel Lythgoe of So You Think You Can Dance. Mr. Moore has worked with many different learning institutions including George Mason University. Mr. Moore enjoys giving back to students of all ages during his summers, where he teaches and mentors at Earl Mosley's Institute of the Arts. Mr. Moore is excited to be back and part of the Dance Institute of Washington, where he first started as a student years ago.

Kahina Haynes, Executive Director, is a passionate arts activist and the visionary architect behind DIW's strategic revitalization following the significant loss of its Founder/Artistic Director, Fabian Barnes. She is an awardee of the 2022 Black Voices for Black Justice Fund, 2022 David Bradt Nonprofit Leadership Award, and 2021 American Express NGen Fellows Award. Prior to her appointment by The Board of Directors, Ms. Haynes worked in program and process evaluation for a number of philanthropic and non-profit organizations including the United Nations (Bureau for Development Policy at UNDP), The Annie E. Casey Foundation, SafeKids Worldwide, and the World Bank Group. Ms. Haynes holds a B.A. from Princeton University with a Minor in African American Studies and a concentration in Dance; as well as a Master's Degree from Oxford University in Evidence Based Social Intervention.

Marcus Johnson is a native of Washington D.C. who has been studying, and training rigorously in professional dance for 12 years. Marcus is trained in Ballet, Modern, African, and Hip Hop and started professionally training at Duke Ellington School of The Arts. Following his tenure at Duke Ellington, Marcus was chosen to tour in China for an international dance conference. He has performed with Sting and Paul Simon, and toured in Los Angeles, where he also kept up his training. Marcus has been teaching dance for 7 years at the Dance Institute of Washington, where he's had the pleasure of instilling all that he has learned through the years to the next generation.

Oyuna Nadmitova-Adams is a native of Ulan-Ude, Republic of Buryatia, Russia. She has studied at The Buryat State Choreographic School and the East Siberian State Academy of Culture and Arts. She has toured with the Moscow Ballet, the Russian National Ballet Theatre Sergey Radchenko, the Moscow State Ballet, and the Imperial Russian Ballet. Oyuna worked for 13 years with Buryat State Opera and Ballet Theater. She taught at the Montgomery Ballet, in Montgomery, Alabama, and the Princess Mhoon Dance Institute. Oyuna joined DIW in August 2024 to focus on training the Middle Division (Relevé I, II, and III).


